STEWARDSHIP

DEMOCRACY

All actions of government must be conducted with transparency, fairness, responsibility and accountability.

- S.107: Election Corrections (expands Automatic Voter Registration beyond DMV to other state agencies that already collect the type of information need to register to vote) PASSED
- H.207: Montpelier Charter/Non-Citizen Voting Passed House, no action in Senate
- H.427: Foreign Credentialing (When professionals move to Vermont from other countries, we will now streamline the consideration of their credentials so they can more quickly practice their profession in VT) SIGNED
- S.134: Municipal Public Safety Workers (allows municipal public safety workers, who can't go on strike because it could jeopardize public safety, to request that contract disputes go to binding arbitration. It's a fairness for those workers and it levels the bargaining field for our police, fire and first responders) PASSED
- S.11: Limits Senate Districts to No More than 3 Members SIGNED
