State Treasurer Beth Pierce discussed the itinerary for her honk and wave in Rutland tomorrow. She encouraged us to share photos on Facebook. Steve Howard will ask state workers to show up. Beth discussed the work of the State Treasurer's office. She asked for our help to spread the word to get out the vote. She is helping with other state-wide campaigns. She believes that affordability isn't about squeezing the bottom line at the expense of the people and that to grow our state we must invest in people. Beth runs the retirement system for the state. As part of this, she also works on providing retirement options for people with small businesses. In addition, she has been working on ABLE (Achieving a Better Life Experience), a savings program for people with disabilities.

Mary Droege discussed Castleton Indivisible efforts to get out the vote, including writing postcards and letters. One big push was in Maine, with 2,500 postcards written to Democratic leaning voters (35 volunteers). This is a nationwide effort. Castleton Indivisible plans to keep up the activism no matter what the election outcome. There is a lot of work to be done.

Beth discussed the options for municipalities struggling to cover the costs of the pandemic.
